Mauricio has recently written a blog post about his available open source ESLint plugin. for the cloud application programming model. Now, this is part of, or taking advantage of an expanded effort for ESLint to focus on more languages and capabilities than just JavaScript and TypeScript. And he's using the JSON plugin that was already available and building on top of it to allow you to parse and check the configuration files specific to CAP, like the package a song but the additional functionality that he has added is checking for deprecated features and keys so if you think that would be a useful addition to your CAP development environment check out his blog post today and install and start using that plug-in.
