[Nico] Hi everyone and welcome to the SAP Developer News. Just a quick update on the SAP UI5 version 1.140 that was just released. A few minor deprecation infos, so as always, there's some older UI5 versions that will now be deprecated for the CDNs, so make sure to update. And also deprecated is the analysis path framework, so if you're using the APF, make sure to switch. It's still officially supported, but it's devised to no longer use it. a few other interesting updates so there's now a typed json model so in case you use typescript and the json model definitely check that one out there's a few updates to the odata v4 model as well some other controls receive little updates make sure to check the release notes and something else i saw was that the color of the title and the tool header changed so check it out and test to see what that now looks like and let me know what you think about that in the comments.
